These are questions to consider when reviewing the accessibility of your library resources. Review what is currently available to identify any gaps in services and areas for improvement.

## How visible is your accessibility information?

- Is it available to view externally?
- How many clicks to navigate to the page?

- Available study spaces
- Virtual library tours and maps
- Accessible books and alternative formats
- Library policies (especially around loan periods)

## How clear is the language you use?

- Is it written in plain English?
- Do you use any jargon that needs to be explained?

## What formats is your information available in (tick all that apply)?

- Online
- Print
- Audio
- Video

## Do you have clear signage around the building?

- Do you have braille or tactile signs?
- Do you have maps showing accessible routes?
